Dear Parents

One of our aims to support our learners is to create opportunities for them. Fourteen thousand five hundred and thirty-nine learners in South Africa entered the S.A. Computer Olympiad - our entries represented 3,9% of this total and we received 3.6% of the total medals awarded: 153 Bronze, 86 Silver and 30 Gold awards.

In perspective 153 learners did better than 50% of the participants countrywide, 86 learners did better than 79% of the participants countrywide and 30 learners did better than 93% of the participants countrywide.

Although we can say well done, we must strive to do even better. **With a team effort our computer lab's will endorse even** better skills. We are working on a new service delivery with regard to coding.

Discipline

Children will make mistakes and teachers will deal with it. Accept your child's mistakes and work with us to put corrective measures into place. We do not condemn but must educate. Yes, teachers also make mistakes as do parents BUT we are not talking about that.

Dictating the outcome or blaming the teacher or other learners is not the way forward. Screaming on social media will not get you the outcome you want nor will it change the channels to be followed or what your child have done.

Winning

Schools claim that they foster a culture of winning and that they grow winners. It is sad to hear how teams then get strengthened with bursaries offered to learners from other schools to fill a gap in their team squads. The idea on high school level is already troublesome BUT the fact that some primary schools have bought into this practice, is of great concern. Is it a case of buying winners because winning had become everything?

At Sunridge we have not and will not take part in this. We coach and teach what is in front of us and should we get beaten or outscored we will accept it and work harder or smarter. This is something I respect in our coaches and is a value that must be taught.

Money cannot buy loyalty, character or morality. Let us do the right thing and support our children irrespective of the outcome. Let us embrace moderate, fair, and positive expectations in line with our children's ability and not our expectations.

We are proud of each and every learner who represents Sunridge - the music learners had a wonderful evening with excellent talent and development. Playing netball in style, the u/13A girls won the gold medal at the Amanda Lingenfelder Fast Five. Well done Sunridge!
