Making sure of the facts is essential and is a matter of principle to pay careful attention to this.

We must always keep in mind the changes our children need to go through to develop in a well balanced way so that they can deal with the all the challenges life will throw at them.

Supporters are always welcome and it is nice to see the passion of parents next to the field of play. I recently attended a **match between two schools and was pleasantly surprised by the one school's supporters' passionate and positive support** even though their team was losing and the referee was slightly biased against them. It brought calmness and respect - things could have been very different although the outcome of the match would have been the same.

Dignity is everything and without a positive attitude it's never possible.

Hoewel ons 'n selfoonvrye omgewing verkies en wens ons kinders wil soos in die ou dae speel, gesels en kuier, is dit 'n ander wêreld daarbuite. Ons moet ons afhanklikheid van hierdie sosiale omgewing dringend omswaai, sodat ons kinders die broodnodige sosiale vaardighede kan ontwikkel.

**Terwyl ons in 'n omgewing vry van invloede van buite met ons netbalspan gereis het, kon ons kennis maak met hul unieke** wêreld en hoe innerlik mooi hulle is - dit is wat ons waarlik mis wanneer hulle op sosiale media gefokus is.

Miskien moet ons ook 'n streng waarskuwing aan ouers rig om te let op wat hulle op sosiale media sê en doen. Om te sien watter advies volwassenes op groepe vra en wat mense bereid is om te sê, is verstommend. Hoe kan ons iets anders van kinders verwag!

Daar is wel insidente by die skool wat deur sommige mense as "boelie" gesien word, maar ons moet onthou wat "boelie" regtig beteken. Raadpleeg asseblief vorige nuusbriewe in hierdie verband. Dit is egter belangrik om insidente en oortredings deur die korrekte kanale aan te meld. Ons sal dit hanteer – miskien sal dit nie wees wat u wil hê nie of ook nie binne u ty-draamwerk val nie.

Ons is werklik geseënd met leerders wat hulle mooi gedra, respek betoon en die waardes waarvoor ons staan, nastrewe. Dit is egter 'n feit dat 'n paar van hulle die grense sal toets.

In alle gevalle is feite die sleutelwoord – maar wat soms as feite voorgehou word, kan dalk net halwe waarhede wees. Dit is 'n struikelblok wat vertroue die nek inslaan en in 99% van alle gevalle vorm dit die basis vir konflik en misverstande. Dit is noodsaaklik om seker te maak van die feite en dit moet 'n saak van beginsel wees om noukeurig aandag hieraan te skenk. Ons moet altyd in gedagte hou dat kinders deur veranderinge moet gaan om op 'n goed gebalanseerde wyse te ontwikkel, sodat hulle al die uitdagings in hul lewe die hoof kan bied.

Ek het onlangs 'n wedstryd tussen twee skole bygewoon en was aangenaam verras oor die passievolle en positiewe ondersteuning van ondersteuners, hoewel hul span besig was om te verloor en die skeidsregter hulle stief behandel het. Dit het kalmte en respek meegebring en dinge kon baie anders gewees het, hoewel die uitkoms van die wedstryd dieselfde sou wees.
